The same day it was used at Harrogate Bus Station for demonstrating a manual wheelchair ramp, fitted at the entrance, in connection with the new B6BLEs. It carries no lettering or fleetname, but shows "Volvo B6BLE – DEMONSTRATOR" as the destination. It did not stay for long, and was not used in service.

Loaned Volvo N967 TJF retains a red stripe on the passenger doors from its Stena Line livery (Stena Sealink is now called Stena Line). Whilst with Stena Line it mainly worked dockside at the port of Dover and carried "Stena Line LYNX" branding. It was still on loan as we closed for Press.


Mercedes 108, in H&D livery without fleetnames, is the only K&D Mercedes to carry an advertisement -

Acquired Vehicles

It is now confirmed that Mainline Atlantean tuition bus 9105 has been acquired, as has similar 9112. Details of both have been given previously.

Additional Information

The situation regarding the takeover of York Pullman has now been clarified and we are grateful to the Company for advising us that the deal has now been completed and the effective date will be Sunday 16th April. As suggested in the February issue, the intention is to retain only the 7 Easylink Darts (short R120-2 FUP; long R130-2 FUP and SPD S140 AGR) and the 86 seat ex Busways Atlantean (AVK 179V), used on a Tadcaster Grammar School contract. It is still intended that First York will operate an open top service during the summer, but will provide it's own vehicles for this and for the other school contracts.

Additional forthcoming news is that it is hoped to replace the remaining Leyland Nationals during the current year, probably by double deckers transferred in, but the two Leyland Leopards, 1595/6, are expected to continue for at

least a further two years, unless suitable replacements can be found within the group inside that time.

Tuition bus 9389 is currently officially "parked up" at James Street.

National 333 remains stored at the premises of Ebor Trucks, Acaster Malbis, but is expected to be sold shortly. Atlantean 6336 is still at James Street and has now had a couple of lower deck windows removed.

Livery Changes

All the repaints are into two tone green, making this the most common livery in the York fleet. Although the livery is intended to eradicate variations, differences in the amount of light green relief being applied, together with placing of fleetnumbers, makes the identification of individual vehicles still quite easy. All five DAF/Deltas are now in the new livery, except 1252 is all green; similarly, 3305 is the last of the batch to go green, though 3304 is in allover

DAF 1253 has regained a rear fleetnumber, as has 5189 (in gold) at the front. The latter still does not have "FirstF" on the front, or York on the sides, and has never had York on the nearside since repaint.

General News

Recently acquired ex First Manchester Atlantean 6463 has an Olympian front grille with the radiator opening blanked off behind, whilst sisters 6464/5 have standard plain Atlantean fronts.

Public Inquiries

Decision. PB 1747 RIDER (YORK) LTD t/a FIRST YORK. At a Public Inquiry held in Leeds on 1 March 2000 the Deputy Traffic Commissioner decided to take no formal disciplinary action against the Operators Licence.

A Formal Warning was issued that "all buses operating registered services must comply with Regulation 13(1)(b) of the Public Service Vehicles (Registration of Local Services) Regulations 1986".

The background to this is that evidence was given by Vehicle Inspectorate bus monitors that in September 1999 they had observed a number of journeys running as much as 18 minutes late and up to 11 minutes early and that two journeys had not been seen. It was claimed that there had been difficulty in identifying journeys as drivers had been changing destination blinds and route numbers before completing their journeys. The Company argued that there was with traffic light phasing at the Heleate Band in the Pariments had with traffic light phasing at the Holgate Road junction. The Council had written to confirm that the experiments had caused severe disruption to the highway network as far as the outer ring road. The Company had known nothing about the experiments before they were carried out and they first came to their attention following complaints from platform staff. The Company has a quality partnership with the City Council and the deputy traffic commissioner commented that despite this, he was being told that the buses had run up to 18 minutes late through a lack of communication with the Council; he found that quite astonishing. The Company's representative advised that lack of communication had never happened before and the evidence was it would not happen again. The deputy commissioner accepted that there was reasonable excuse for many of the failures as he had no alternative but to conclude that the changes at Holgate Road had a significant effect on the ability of the company to achieve a reasonable performance; he therefore took no

However, he warned the company that it's buses must show the correct destination and service number and pointed out they were required to do so by the 1986 regulations. As a result of this decision, services 12 and 22 can no longer change their destination display at Stonebow. Buses passing through Stonebow showing "Station Road Monument" will still continue to Haxby or Wigginton as at present, with 12s changing to 22s at the Monument and vice versa. The ruling may also affect services 3/33 at Acomb Park, 2/4 at Foxwood Lane and 1/5 at Beckfield Lane.

OPERATING NOTES

City of York Council will shortly be seeking the views of local residents to help it formulate a five-year Local

Transport Plan for York. This will be submitted to the Government in July for funding.

At the City of York Planning and Transportation Committee's meeting on 9th February, it was agreed that a Traffic Regulation Order will be advertised for a City Centre Bus Priority Scheme. This £50,000 scheme aims to cut congestion and under it a single site, directly opposite Garden Place mini roundabout, will be used to control access to Stonebow and Coppergate. A combination of "modern technology" and a "rising bollard" will be used to control traffic movement. The impact of the scheme on St. Saviourgate will be assessed three months after implementation.

Dart 3374 was seen at Bainbridge, near Hawes, on 5/3 showing "Private Hire" on the destination.

Dart 3368 was used at a "Bus surgery" event on 25/3 in Parliament Street. Present at this quaintly titled event (which did not allow visitors to make alterations or repairs to buses!) were representatives from First York, Arriva and the City Council.

McArthur Glenn Dart 3313 was working on 23 on 14/3 whilst an Alexander Dart was on the 99. The McArthur

Glenn vehicles are apparently often used before 0900 on other duties before going onto the 99.

A Yellow Line bus works right through from Grimston Bar and on to the White Line to Askham Bar to transport students to the Sixth Form/Technical College in a morning, with the reverse in the evening.

3343 was noted working on 22A on 23/3.

Withdrawn from Arriva serving Southend (Southend Transport) and passed to Houston Ramm (dealer), Rochdale, by 2/00. Still wearing Green Line livery and for sale. Staff at the Rochdale yard advise that B83 SWX (ex 2711) has also been acquired and was in the paint shop, but this is not confirmed.

N408 ENW (Ex Rider York 8408, Scania)

Now in First Group corporate "willowleaf" livery and reported as having been re-seated to First Group standard, though this is not confirmed. During January was in use on service X22 into Edinburgh. It is thought that due to a slight decrease in vehicle requirements on "Fife First" services, this vehicle has been released into the main First Edinburgh fleet for general use. It carries fleet number 508.

EPD 542V (Ex K&D 263, Leyland National sold "Passoon", 6/98)

Further to the note in the February issue, it is now understood that this vehicle was at Imperial Travel, Rainham, for maintenance on behalf of Mike Nash (dealer), Weybridge, the current owner. However, the display of Imperial Travel legal ownership on the vehicle suggests that Imperial may have used it for a short time.

D926 KWW (Ex HIT/H&D 105, Dodge sold Ripley, Carlton)

Still running 2/00 with Banga Travel, Wolverhampton.

ROAD CAR LEYLAND NATIONALS

Further to last month's notes, the four vehicles at Gainsborough, UWY 65/70/73/76X, are used on rural services to Retford and Worksop, for example on 23rd February UWY 65/73X (Road Car 295/3) were on the Retford service, UWY 76X (Road Car 296) was on the Worksop service and UWY 70X (Road Car 297) was on the Scunthorpe service. The vehicle at Lincoln, PNW 605W (Road Car 292) forms a float of 6 vehicles there, though Lincoln's National 2s are often outstationed in a small shed at Walcott village, south of Lincoln.

In the February issue we queried why, on a photograph of a Leyland Royal Tiger Doyen in Classic Bus, the vehicle should have been carrying London Country and Sovereign Olympian registration number A138 DPE. The answer is given in the current issue of Classic Bus. It appears that the photograph is a publicity shot taken by Leyland and the vehicle was actually A839 SYR for Grey-Green. The body was built by Roe at Crossgates and at the time the photograph was to be taken, for some reason the vehicle was still unregistered. A handy registration plate must therefore have been "borrowed" from a nearby vehicle on the production line, which was Olympian A138 DPE, simply for photographic purposes. A final note on this matter is that the Doyen has now been acquired for preservation by Mike Nash.
