#### **Additional Information**

Olympian 331 is due to receive "Cherished Registration" H12 SDW from H&D Iveco 281 in late March. Two other K&D vehicles are also expected to receive private plates shortly.

The Demonstration B6 arrived at Keighley on Friday 12th January and was expected to stay for up to a week. Owned by Volvo Bus Ltd, it is a low floor example with capacity for a wheelchair. Seating capacity is displayed as B36F+18; B28F+26 and B33F+18+1 wheelchair. It is in a silver-grey livery with silhouettes of figures on each side extending onto the glass. From the front these are a wheelchair-bound person; a mother with pushchair; mother with children and man with briefcase. It is understood to have a "kneeling" facility and has no steps internally, even at the entrance, until over halfway along the bus. This flat front area has 2 inward facing seats behind the driver, separated by the wheelarch, whilst on the nearside a luggage pen is then followed by a single inward facing seat. There then follows a large standee area well supplied with handrails and grab rails, which on each side has 4 fold-down inward facing seats and 2 fixed forward facing seats. It is in this area that a wheelchair would be accommodated. From there two steps take passengers into a raised portion - again well supplied with handrails which holds 16 seats, with a final step giving access to the rear 5 seats. Whilst the concept of easy access is gaining ground and is to be welcomed, it has to be said that this particular example is probably less successful than some. With a maximum of only 15 seats available in the "low floor" area, these will soon be filled by mothers, children and pensioners and the rear portion of the bus, accessed by two quite steep steps, will prove difficult for the "overflow" to negotiate. In addition, standing in this rear portion - even with the plentiful handrails - raises the prospect of being thrown down the two steps into the lower part in the event of heavy braking or an accident, with consequent increased risk of injury.

Members may be interested in a "translation" of the Volvo "Vehicle Identification Number" (or VIN) codes:- YV3 = Manufacturer code (Volvo Bus Corp); R3 = chassis type (B6); 6S = engine type (TD63 ES); 1 = brake system (compressed air); 5 = control number; P = year model (1993); C = assembly plant (Irvine, Scotland); 005406 = chassis number. Further, the TD63 ES has a bore of 98.425mm, stroke of 120.00 mm, displacement of 5.48dm³ (litres) and compression ratio of 18.3:1. Output @ 2600 rpm = 154 kw or 210 hp; Torque @ 1560 rpm = 700 Nm or 71 kpm. It meets Euro 1 requirements.

### **Additional Information**

1544 is an addition to the vehicles listed last month and was from the CalderLine fleet at Halifax, though of course it was new to West Yorkshire as 2574. Olympian 5206 should be deleted from last month's list, however; it appears that it was not on loan and was probably at York with a Private Party for the St.Nicholas Fair. At least 1544 and 7121 gained York blinds, but 5201 did not and the position with 7038 is not known. The Olympian had gone from York by 26/12, the Fleetlines followed by 30/12 and 1544 had gone by 15/1. 1340 is from the Leeds City Link fleet at Kinsley and is one of the two Volvo re-engined ex West Yorkshire Nationals. It was at York in early January. Also at York, on 13th January, but not in service was ex Kingfisher Huddersfield Mercedes 2221.

**Livery Changes** 

New Rider York livery:- 1208. This uses a darker green than previous examples 1202/5; this later version is slightly darker than Rider green - almost Tilling green. At least 1202 has now gained the darker green over it's previous paler green. A more detailed description of the livery is that the sides have a green skirt which rises in two stripes towards the rear; cream above the rubber body strip and a green stripe along the cant rail. All except the cant rail stripe continues round the front, but the rear is all green except for a cream area below the rear window which contains the Rider York fleetname in red and FirstBus symbol in grey. These appear on each side towards the front and on the front itself below the windscreen. Fleetnumbers are black at the front, on the cream, and yellow at the rear, on the green.

General:- Many of the York double deckers have lost their side fleetnames but some of the VR's have retained the YR flashes at front and rear where main YR fleet examples have had these removed.

Notes in the margin suggest that the following services were operated by J types: - 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 13, 17, 18, 17A, 18A, 64, 65, 66, 81, 82 and 92 and that 39 seaters were for services 14, 15, 16, 43 and 80 but not 20, 38, 39, 70, 71.

It appears that the fleets reached the 500 mark, probably for the first time ever, in June 1952, made up of

During all this the question of whether the new double deckers should be 7ft 6ins or 8ft wide arose. On 12/7/49 a letter to Mr.Dean from the Tilling Group raised the question of producing all double deck chassis "in say 1951 eight feet wide instead of 7ft 6ins as at present. A change over will have to be made sometime.

"Will you please, therefore, investigate the possibility of using this wider type of vehicle on your various services and see whether the number you are ordering for 1951 onwards could be absorbed.

"The production of double decker in two different widths will not be as economical as producing one type.

"As a rough guide I believe that the Licensing Authorities will not generally object to the use of the wider vehicle on a road having a 20' wide carriageway. At a later date application would, of course, have to be made to the Licensing Authorities for the sanction to operate.".

Mr.Dean replied on 14/7/49 "...I think we can safely say that the double decked vehicles to be ordered from 1951 onwards can all be 8ft wide.

"When the programmes have been settled we can make application to the Licensing Authority for sanction to operate them, and we should be able to find a number of Services which would be approved".
