ADDITIONAL INFORMATION 1001/3 were delivered on 3rd October and the other new vehicles also arrived during October. 1001-3 are the first Series B Nationals for the Company, and were delivered as B44F + 16 standees, but they have entered service as just 44 seaters. 2335/557 are the first of the 1978 order for Leopard/Plaxtons.

It is understood that there are two coaches and 8 dual purpose vehicles in this order. It will be noted that the numbers for these vehicles take account of the forthcoming renumbering of coaches/due? purpose vehicles as outlined last month although it appears that the dual purpose RELL6G'S(1333-44) are not to be renumbered.

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Leaner bus 4058 does not carry an unladen weight. The bodies of 2335/557 are of Plaxton Supreme Type (2557 Supreme Express).

TECENT WITHDRAWALS The withdrawal of 1081 (801CWU)marks the end of another class of Bristol Chassis in West Yorkshire service. The first MW, EUG 70 (TWT 122) arrived At Harrogate almost exactly 21 years ago, and the model has been represented ever since, a total of 70 being owned. With the departure of the last one, the Gardner 6HLW engine is also extinct in the fleet, all the remaining Gardner engined saloons having 6HLX versions.
