ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The hew leopard/Plaxtons all arrived from mid-December onwards. They have the 1979 style of front, and the sides also differ from the 1978 batch. The 1978 vehicles (2557-64) have a strip of white below the windows whereas on the 1979 batch the beading between the red and white forms, the window sill and hence there is no white below the windows. This is quite a noticeable difference. The new Leopards also have different gear ratios, but are still 2 pedal control. The new style Plaxton bodies do not have body number plates at the side of the step as hitherto; does anyone know where this plate is now fixed, please?

Further details of the recent United acquisitions are that 1126 (2817) was ex Durham and has never been at Alnwick, whilst 1405 (6008) was transferred to Gallowgate in late August for a short time before sale to WY:

The Lincolnshire Lodekkas loaned at various timeshave in some cases had an interesting subsequent history. 2504 (RFE 476) on return to Lindoln was prepared for service and sent to Skegness for the summer. It was then loaned during October to Yorkshire Traction, with 2504/5 (TVL305/6) but these were replaced for November by four National Travel (West) coaches. 2506 (TVL 307), returned on 3rd May, was not in fact broken up but has turned up with the "Gale Force Motor Cycle Display Team", of Huntingdon. The team is sponsored by National Tyre Service.

New Ford Escort KWW 166V is at present in use by is the M.A.P. Project Leader. Similar car KWW 159V is a light, "sand", type colour.

- 1. Withdrawall dates for 1253/5/60 are C of F expiry dates; all three remained licensed but unused until 31/12/79. The C of F's of 1259/62 expired on 1/1/80 and 7/1/80 respectively, and 3797 on 7/1/80.
- 2. 1800 has been out of use for some time and 1784 was not used for at least the last three weeks of December. 1802 had spent only 1 month on CRW allocation (at Leeds). 1813 although now on CRW remains at Leeds for the present; they have just taken the trouble to give it a partial repaint.
- 3. There are now only 7 main fleet and 15 York Lodekkas in stock
- 4. The official allocation date for 2571-6 is 1/1/80, but none was licensed until at least the 7th January.
- 5. These are the first moves since new for 1335/93; 1403, on the other hand, returns to its original depot.
- 6. The delicensing of 2103/5 does not necessarily herald their withdrawal.

STORED VEHICLES

Bradford Still outside on 7th January were 1782/5 (sold to Rollinson on the 3rd December). Leeping them company was 1776/84/7/9. whilst inside were presumably 2106, 1159 and 1259.

Harrogate Probably as a result of the present building works at Grove Park, 1265/70 had been moved by 5th January and are now behind Skipton depot.

Leeds Still in a corner of the depot is 1206 with a "no parts to be removed" sticker. Outside in the yard are:1162, 1255/60/2.

Skipton Behind the depot on 5th January were 1163, 1812(not in sale livery) and 1265/70 (in sale livery).

York In the field on 1st January were 1150, 3798, 1806 and possibly 1153 and 3797. Also there was new 2573.

UNLADEN WEIGHTS

Two conflicts to require confirmation are that 1320 appears to show 7680 kg instead of 7620 kg, and 1332 appears to have 7553 kg instead of 7658 kg. Both require confirmation because of the dirt that covers unladen weight transfers at this time of year! 1443 now carries an unladen weight of8-3-0 instead of 8-13-0. 1378/80/2/7 - all 7633 kg; 1425 - 8-17-2 (ex 8-12-0); 3963 - 8928 kg.

In addition, 1423 and 2558 do not have large fleet numbers and 2508 has large numbers at the front only, the d hers remaining small.

GENERAL NEWS

Following recent repairs, 1496 now has black bumpers and had no logo at the front but one has since been refitted.

1940 (B) carries an express destination blind at present.

The engine of withdrawn 3798 has been removed as a spare.

Besides 3961, further vehicles to have the rear route number box removed and a plain panel inserted are 3958/9/60/2. There are probably no others done at present - 3957 retains a rear indicator and it seems likely that only 1979 YVR overhauls are affected. On overhaul, 1378 retains it unique NBC moquette seats.

1802 appears to have had an engine change at Central Works towards the end of December, prior to its allocation to Keighley. This seems to be the first major work done to a main fleet Lodekka for some months, previous victims of mechanical failure having been withdrawn.

ADVERTISEMENT NEWS

1723 has now been completed as an overall advert. As described last month, the basiscolour is white, and is for a firm called "Motorcycle World", of Manningham Lane, Bradford, who deal in Honda Motorcycles. The signwriting was done by a firm from the South of England, in Westmoreland Street Body Shop. As with previous overall advert buses for the Company, the fleetname is now above the door.

3431/1313 have a side advert for "Buywell Carpet Centre". At York the latest rear advert for Newitts is "Right Way to Sport".

A new side advert was "Another Littlewoods \(\frac{3}{4} \) Millionaire" but this was soon withdrawn when the winner died suddenly. The "Bus it and Save your Energy" side advert has been surprisingly

Other changes to take effect from 7th January 1980 affect service 216, where the 0752 journey from Roecliffe to St. Aidans now operates via Stockwell Road in Knaresborough instead of Bond End, and service 275, where the 0840 journey from New Inn to Pannal Station now operates via Church Lane in Pannal instead of Rossett Green Lane, Burn Bridge, Westminster Drive and Rosedale.

A number of changes took place from 6th January 1980, in the Aberford, Collingham, Crossgates, Knaresborough, Red Hall, Sandbeck, Scholes, Stanks, Wetherby and Whinmoor areas and a leaflet was issued giving details.

A new service (744) operates from Leeds to Aberford via Crossgates to enable residents in the Aberford area to shop at Crossgates.

New regular hourly circular services during shopping hours are 745 Leeds-Scholes-Crossgates-Leeds and 746 Leeds-Crossgates-Scholes-Leeds.

A new hourly service on Monday to Saturday mornings and afternoons is 795 Leeds-Red Hall-Whinmoor, replacing the present service 737. Another new service is 796 to Stableck Estate, Wetherby.

Old services now renumbered include 738 (now 798), 739 (now 799), 740 (now 796 and 797), 748 (now 743 and 744), and 750 (now 749 Leeds-Stanks-Scholes and 747 Scholes-Stanks-Leeds).

On service 741 the 1555 journey from Wetherby to Leeds is retimed to depart at 1600 and run 5 minutes later, whilst on Service 742, the Mon-Sat 0605 journey from Red Hall to Leeds will now start from Whinmoor Middle School at 0604 and on Saturdays an additional journey will be operated from Whinmoor Middle School (0704) and Red Hall (0705) to Leeds.

Christmas and New Year arrangements were a little more complicated this year by the way the Holidays fell in relation to the week. Thus on both Monday 24th December and Monday 31st December certain additional services were run for shoppers, but all services were progressively withdrawn during the evening. On Christmas Day no services were operated and on Boxing Day a restricted service only was operated. Generally on Thursday and Friday 27th, 28th December a normal service was operated with certain exceptions. Normal services operated on Saturday and Sunday 29th and 30th December. On 1st January Sunday services ran on all runtes with a few generally minor exceptions one of the main ones being on Leeds-Ripon, where the United car did not operate.

4. OPERATING NOTES

We have felt for some time that the "Operating Notes" section of the Bulletin has lost much of its appeal to members. Partly

this is because the notes are difficult to read, but also it must be due to the fact that many of the notes have been of only slightly unusual or even commonplace workings. We have therefore decided as an experiment to divide this section into two. "Operating Notes" will in future refer to such items as the route allocation of vehicles or details of interesting duties. A new section, "Unusual Workings" will deal with just such items and will be in date order for ease of reading.

A point worth noting by correspondents is that the use of a semi-coach on stage services is no longer unusual, and will become even less so when all the 21 on order have been delivered. One other small point is that with recent route renumberings there are no longer any duplications in the Company's route numbers and it is therefore not necessary for us to prefix York-West Yorkshire route numbers with

The reason for 2560 beinging in National white is to enable it to be the regular vehicle on Leeds-Sunderland (359). When 2560 is receiving maintenance, 2564 is the usual substitute. United's contribution is usually one of their Leopard/Duples in the 62xx (ABR---S) series, which are in DP livery. However on 31/12 one of their RELH/ECW DP50F and on 1/9, an RELH/ECW43F, both in DP livery were covering the United duty.

The new Leopard/Plaxton DP's, together with the repainting of 2545-9 into DP livery, should enable Leeds/Bradford-Scarborough (43) to be worked regularly by semi-luxury vehicles, a move which is amply justified by the distance and journey time involved. Other longish routes such as Harrogate-Scarborough (54) and Leeds-Ripon(36) are also steadily receiving more semi-Luxury vehicles - on 1st January, for example, 2564 was on 54 and 2567 has been on this route on several occasions. Wetherby based 2569/70 have been on 78 regularly. We would like details of the use of Otley's 2574 since Otley rotas involve their vehicles on a number of routes.

OTHER BRISTOLS

The C registered ex Bristol Omnibus MW with a bus body recorded in issue 343 has now been seen again and identified. It is CHY416 C, which was in Leeds on 18/12/79, again carrying passengers. The present ownership continues to be a mystery, however, as no fleetname is carried and the vehicle has so far always been moving, precluding an inspection of the legal ownership panel.

Kennedy's Film Services are also now running an ex Bristol MW bus, but their's is in use as a mobile canteen. It has an 87- RAE registration and as such may well be 870 RAE, which was formerly with Barnes Caterers, Wakefield, and recorded in Issue 319.

LEEDSDEPOT

Work is at present in progress on bricking up several of the doorways onto Roseville Road, which have remained unused for many years.

HARROGATE DEPOT

Work commenced a couple of months ago on alterations to Grove Park to bring facilities up to the Leeds and Bradford Depot standards. This includes the provision of new pits.
