Although not directly affecting West Yorkshire, the Ripon area services of United were revised from 29th February 1976. Pares have been increased, although by less than is necessary to cover the deficit being incurred in the area, and services have been reduced mainly during the evenings. #### 6. TEN YEARS AGO.

A number of new vehicles had entered service in March 1966; these were DX206 (Leeds); DX 207/8/9 (Malton); DX210 (York); and KDX 222/3 (Meighley). These had replaced SGLIG/2, SGM1/7/8/12 and NDB15/31. Also withdrawn were KSGLI8/9/22/3, which had been replaced by SUL4A's KSMA1 4, which had been transferred from the main fleet.

#### PUBLICITY.

The Company has had several items on BCC TV's "Look North" programme during the past month. One concerned the sage of the Spofforth bus shelter that was built by the local council 100 yards from the nearest bus stop. Look North's reporter John Burns visited the bus shelter on 10th February and failed to board 1309, which was bound for Tadcaster on 78. The following day it was reported that a meeting between interested parties had been hold, and a bus stop was to be provided at the bus shelter, at least in one direction.

The news that rail fares are to be increased from the end of March resulted in a report on 18th February on long distance coach services. This was filmed in Wellington Street Coach Station, Leeds, and although a North Vestern Leopard was featured, in several of the shots a Vest Yorkshire new type SRG, presumably on one

of the East Coastals, was seen.

A photograph of 1447(L) showing "/etherby/40" standing alongside Metro Leeds 6064, appears in the March issue of "Buses".

#### PORTABLE LETTER BOXES.

An item in the Yorkshire Post reported that the postal facility on the last Pateley Bridge - Harrogate had been withdrawn over the weekend 7/8 February.

However, an item on BBC TV "Look North" on 27th February cowered the event and included a view of 1444. Apparently it was the last portable post box in the North East and was costing the Post Office 24p a letter. Nevertheless it was a little publicised legacy of pre-war days when vehicles carried the box on species brackets under the Autovac.

From 29th February 1976 all children up to the age of 5 can travel free on all WY and YWY services provided that not more than one child accompanies any fare-paying passenger. Additional children irrespective of age must still be paid for. The fare for children of 5 and up to 14 years of age remains at half the adult fare.
